One can barely open one of Wodehouse's books without coming across a lawyer or two, so it is high time that members were provided with a reasonably comprehensive list from which to select their favourite member of the profession.

Appleby, Josiah

of Marlowe, Thorpe, Prescott, Winslow & Co, one of many lawyers appearing in *The Girl on the Boat*.

Attwater, Ebenezer

in *Big Money*, the lawyer of Berry Conway's late aunt, who lent Berry two hundred pounds to keep going.

Bagshott, Sam

a newly-qualified barrister, and writer of stories for *Wee Tots*, in *Galahad at Blandings*.

Bastable, Sir Raymond

Queen's Counsel in *Cocktail Time*, who wrote a best-selling novel after having his hat knocked off by a brazil nut shot by the Earl of Ickenham.

Bellamy, Max

J B Hoke's American lawyer in *Big Money*, whose skills were highly respected by Mr Robbins, who acted in a similar capacity for T Patterson Frisby.

Bennett, Rufus

father of Wilhelmina and, for the plot of *The Girl on the Boat*, only incidentally a member of Bennett, Mendelbaum & Co.

Bodger, Sir Joseph

King's Counsel in *Romance of a Bulb-Squeezer* who made a speech defending Clarence Mulliner from a claim for £10,000 and a new pair of trousers, which set new standards in interpreting the principle of the Liberty of the Subject.

Boole, Mr

of Mainprice, Mainprice & Boole, in *Something Fresh*, to whom Ashe Marson applied for a job.

Bunting, Cyril

of Bunting, Satterthwaite & Miles in *Frozen Assets*. He, or another Bunting, also appeared in *Life with Freddie* in *Plum Pie*, when the firm's name had lost the 'Miles'.

Driscoll, Mr

Queen's Counsel, present at the start of Adrian Mulliner's narrative in *From a Detective's Notebook*, published in *The World of Mr Mulliner*.

Erridge, Alexander

of Nichols, Erridge, Trubshaw & Nichols, received a mere mention in *Bachelors Anonymous*.

Halliday, Johnny

Barrister, in *The Girl in Blue* and *A Pelican at Blandings*, who was required to cross-examine his new fiancée Linda Gilpin, with unfortunate consequences for their relationship.

Harrison, Mr

a member of Harrison, Harrison, Harrison & Harrison who appeared in three stories in *A Man of Means*.

Haskell, Leonard

American lawyer of Haskell & Green, handling the estate of Edmund Biffen Pyke in *Frozen Assets*.

Jellicoe~Smith, Mr

King's Counsel in *Something Fresh*, whose cross-examination of Lord Stockheath in a breach-of-contract case had caused a certain amusement.

Jervis, Mr

managing clerk at Shoesmith, Shoesmith, Shoesmith, Shoesmith & Shoesmith, in *Ice in the Bedroom*.

Lippincott, J Bromley

of Lippincott, Lippincott, Cohn, Mendelbaum & Lippincott, acted for the plaintiff in a case of plagiarism in *Barmy in Wonderland*.

Marlowe, Sir Mallaby

of Marlowe, Thorpe, Prescott, Winslow & Co, and father of Sam Marlowe in *The Girl on the Boat*. Jno Peters was his solicitor's clerk.

McCorkadale, Mrs

Barrister and parliamentary candidate in *Much Obliged, Jeeves.*

Miller, Jeff

Barrister in *Money in the Bank* who upset the judge during his first appearance in Court.

Mortimer, Henry

another character in The Girl on the Boat.

Nichols, Jerry

the newest partner, who 'speaks like a human being', of Nichols, Erridge, Trubshaw & Nichols.

Phillimore, Edwin

connected with Birkett, Birkett, Birkett, Son, Podmore, Podmore & Birkett, who in *Sam the Sudden* was reported to have been bitten by a guinea pig.

Plimsoll, Harold

The Havershot family lawyer in Laughing Gas.

Pyke, George Alexander

The future Lord Tilbury worked as a clerk in an anonymous solicitor's office before building his publishing megalith and receiving his peerage.

Pyle, Homer

of Pyle, Wisbeach & Hollister in *The Girl in Blue*. His sister, Barney Claybourne, was arrested for shoplifting.

Robbins, Mr

of Robbins, Robbins, Robbins & Robbins who, in *Big Money*, acted for T Patterson Frisby in the matter of *The Dream Come True*.

Scrope, Willoughby

of Scrope, Ashby & Pemberton, where he employed Mabel as his Receptionist and Perce as his Office Boy in *The Girl in Blue*.

In addition to those firms mentioned above, the following have also made an appearance:

Bodger, Bodger & Bodger

likely to send a communication concerning alleged libel to Potter of the Yard, on behalf of Mike Bond in *Do Butlers Burgle Banks?*

Boles, Boles, Widgery, Widgery & Boles

Sir Buckstone Abbott hoped they would approve his plan to dynamite the houseboat *Mignonette* in *Summer Moonshine*.

Finch, Finch, Butterfield & Finch

in *The Small Bachelor*, his membership of the firm had been the source of the late Thomas Finch's wealth, and thus his nephew George's fortune.

Henderson, Henderson, Henderson & Henderson

A fictional firm invented by Jerry Shoesmith in *Frozen Assets*.

Shoesmith, Mr

of Shoesmith, Shoesmith, Shoesmith & Shoesmith. Gave a brief to Jeff Miller in *Money in the Bank*, and at various times employed Freddie Widgeon and Joe Pickering. He was Jerry Shoesmith's father.

Stevens, Mr

of Parbury & Stevens, appearing in the magazine story *Disentangling Old Percy*.

Stoganbuhler, Mr

Jane Hunnicutt's American lawyer in *The Girl in Blue*.

Trout, Ephraim

American lawyer of the firm Trout, Wapshott & Edelstein in *Bachelors Anonymous*, one of many legal firms employed by Ivor Llewellyn.

Trubshaw, B J

another incidental partner in Nichols, Erridge, Trubshaw & Nichols.

Weems, Henry

of Kelly, Dubinsky, Wix, Weems & Bessinger in French Leave, acting for the Trent sisters in the potential sale of their late father's dramatic composition Brother Masons to Hollywood.

Wetherby, J G

of Polk, Wetherby, Polk & Polk, was 'an old bloke with a face like a halibut', according to Syd Price in *If I Were You*.

And an Imposter

Jeeves purported to be an unnamed lawyer in *Aunts Aren't Gentlemen*, ch 19.

Jones, Jukes, Jenkinson & Jerningham

in *Bachelors Anonymous*, a firm to which Ikey Llewellyn threatened to transfer his legal work if Ephraim Trout did not visit him immediately.

Nichols, Erridge & Trubshaw

Nichols, Nichols & Nichols

Two further incarnations of B J Trubshaw's firm in *Bachelors Anonymous*, and the earlier *Uneasy Money*, respectively.

Shapiro, Shapiro & Shapiro

Wapshott, Wapshott & Wapshott

both mentioned in passing in Pigs Have Wings.

Shoesmith, Shoesmith, Shoesmith & Shoesmith

Gained the extra partner in *Ice in the Bedroom* and *Service with a Smile*.
