

SECTION L c Names of Major Penguin Artists (see the *Addendum to McIlvaine*, pages 9 to 11)

Penguin has produced more Wodehouse titles in paperback than any other publisher. They have appeared in a variety of styles and sizes, and because of their widespread availability, this section of the *Addendum* summarises which titles are known to have appeared in each design.

Penguin's original design was three horizontal stripes. Subsequently all covers have had some illustration. In the list that follows, each title is given its original McIlvaine reference number plus the Penguin prefix for the relevant edition. There then follows the list of designs in which the title can be found based on the following key:

The Penguin Wodehouse Companion was compiled by Richard Usborne in 1988, and comprised material from his two books *Wodehouse at Work to the End* and *A Wodehouse Companion*. The front cover featured a sketch by David Low which first appeared in *New Statesman and Nation* on 23rd December, 1933, and accompanied a biography of Wodehouse which was one of twelve appearing in the journal between 21st October, 1933 and 6th January, 1934.
