 - It was also published by Samuel French, Inc (New York) in 1953, and the full text was included in the magazine *Theatre Arts* in March 1949.

In addition, in 2009 a book entitled *Bobbles and Plum; Four Satirical Playlets* 'by Bertram Fletcher Robinson and P G Wodehouse' was published. These playlets had all appeared in the UK press between 1903 and 1907, but there is no evidence that any were ever performed.
