Fai - Guide to using the Index to Wooster Sauce

This index covers all issues of *Wooster Sauce* published since The P G Wodehouse Society (UK) was founded in 1997.

The index is a very general index, with two separate lists, the first covering subject-matter, and the second naming the authors who have contributed, in alphabetical order. Neither part of the index includes information about people, places or topics which are mentioned in an article but are not its principal subjects.

Section F a ii below provides a list of Issue Numbers and Dates.

In both parts of the index, the subject or author (given in bold print) is followed by the title of the article and, also in bold, the issue and page number. For example, 1-1 is *Wooster Sauce* issue 1, page 1; 20-12 is issue 20, page 12.

See Section F a ii for the dates of each Wooster Sauce issue number. In some cases this index may refer to a reference beginning BTW, such as BTW-5. This refers to the Index for the issue numbers of By the Way, listed in Section F b i.

The Author Index includes contributors to special items where relevant, even if the contributor did not write the whole article.

Some articles may be referred to under more than one heading in the Subject Index.

Regular columns and features such as Recent Press Comment, and regular filler items, are included under their own heading in the Subject Index. One exception is Future Events for, although this has appeared in every issue, for obvious reasons its entire content has been omitted from the digitisation.

The regular feature of Poet's Corner includes the title of each PGW poem published in *Wooster Sauce*. Certain (but not all) subjects of The Bibliographic Corner columns are indexed; all are listed under the Bibliographic Corner heading in chronological order.

The editor of this index has chosen a word-by-word approach to alphabetization, meaning that once a space is inserted, alphabetization is interrupted. However, words containing dashes, hyphens, and apostrophes are treated as single words, ignoring the punctuation.

Otherwise a strict letter-by-letter alphabetization rule has been applied, which means, for example, that 'Mac' and 'Mc' names are not grouped together (as done in many library catalogues) but are in their correct alphabetical location (so that, eg, 'MacKenzie, Compton / Make Way for Newts' appears earlier in the index than 'McClure, Victoria / Meeting with a legend').

There are three important exceptions:

The articles 'A' and 'The' at the beginning of a title or subject <u>are ignored</u> in alphabetization, which begins with the next word; but they <u>are included</u> for alphabetizing purposes later in the sentence. Accordingly, you will find, for example these items in the order shown:

The Wodehouse Way

- ii 'St' is alphabetized as if spelled out ('Saint'); and
- iii Numbers rendered in numeric form (eg '9' rather than 'Nine') are placed first in a list of titles, followed by spelled-out titles.
